

A new bike trail along the C&D canal

Delaware has completed a paved bike trail along the northern side of the Chesapeake and Delaware ship canal. Maryland has a bike trail which links up with the Delaware bike trail. At the present time there is discussion of a bike ferry across the canal from Chesapeake City on the south shore to the paved bike trail on the north side. This would provide access to the restaurants and stores in Chesapeake City for bike traffic. The Delaware trail is named the Michael Castle Trail and the MD trail is named for Ben Cardin after the politicians who sheparded the funding support. There are four access points with parking and restrooms in Delaware.
